Only two hits for Mulvane in the game and both came off the bat of junior centerfielder Barry Milligan, who was the only runner the Cats advanced past second base.

Three more in the fourth put Mulvane back in the hunt before consecutive strikeouts with a runner at third ended the drive. Vic Marcelle singled with one out, Dale Landes walked and Chris Hicks plated Marcelle with a hit. Two more scored on a triple by Turner before J.C. Shook and Darrin Faris fanned.

The Wildcats let one slip away and were checked in a second game Friday, April 16, at Campus (Haysville) in a non-league make-up doubleheader. The Colts came from a 9-5 deficit to edge the Cats, 12-10, in the opener, then silenced the Mulvane bats in the second game, 5-1.

The visiting Wildcats sprinted to the lead in the first game, scoring five runs in the second. Marcelle started the thunder with a single on the first pitch. Hits by Turner, Darrin Faris, Whitmer and Todd Robinson climaxed the inning.

Overail, Landes went 1 for 3 with four runs scored, Faris had a hit and scored two times and both Whitmer and Robinson had a pair of hits.

In the nightcap, Landes spun a fine five-hitter but two of them were home runs, a three-run shot in the fifth was damaging.
