Hitting Still Sparking MHS Baseball Team

Baseball coaches always preach about defense and pitching carrying the load early in the season and the hitting coming along but that's not the case for Coach David Katzenmeier's MHS Wildcats.

The Wildcats are hitting with gusto in the early going and that crack of the bats is music to Katzenmeier's ears.

The Cats hogtied Winfield in a single game Monday afternoon, booming out 16 hits in a 12-3 victory in a non-league game. That win boosted the Mulvane record to 3-2.

In a doubleheader Friday, Mulvane and Rose Hill split a pair, the Cats coming from behind for a 12-7 win in the opener and Rose Hill choking off the Cat bats, 4-0, in the nightcap in Mulvane.

"We're hitting the ball about as good as any team I've seen here," stressed Katzenmeier. "We're scoring runs and I've been a little surprised. In the last couple of games, the bottom of the order, guys like David Belew, Jeff Belden, Mike Shook and Kris Withrow, have been banging the ball. That's really going to make us tough if they continue hitting like that and the top of the order keeps hitting. It's going to make us pretty tough."

Against Winfield, junior lefthander Mike Stump had his first start of the year and made the most of it, giving up only two hits before junior righthander Brian Cusick mopped up on the combined five-hitter.

Greg Quigley's base knock in the first drove in Mike Snow with the game's first run, and the Wildcats added three more in each of the fourth and fifth innings. Shook and Stump had RBI hits

In the first game, senior Greg Wilson went 2-for-4 with two runs scored, Withrow knocked in a pair of runs, going 2-for-4, Belew had a pair of RBIs and sophomore Curtis Hicks rapped a two-run pinch-hit single to highlight a four-run sixth inning that put the game on ice.

The Wildcats will be back in action today when Valley Center comes to Mulvane for a league doubleheader. The game has been moved to a 3 p.m. starting time (as has Monday's twinbill with Campus) because of some lighting problems at the ball diamond.
