The Wildcat baseballers continued their strong surge, adding four victories this week to run their overall record to 8-3 with eight straight victories. The Cats rallied twice to derail Campus, 9-5 and 12-7, in a non-league doubleheader in Haysville Monday, April 21, and in two Chisholm Trail League encounters, the Cats trimmed Valley Center, 9-5 and 3-1, at VC Thursday, April 17.

The CTL wins gave Mulvane a 5-1 league log.

At Haysville, both victories came off the comeback trail. The Colts held a 5-4 lead after three before Mulvane scored five unanswered runs in the last four innings and the nightcap was even more exciting because the Cats scored nine times in the top of the seventh to pull the game out.

"I keep telling the guys that hitting is contagious and once we started hitting it was contagious," Katzenmeier. Until the 7th, MHS had been held to only four hits but outfielder Mike Snow got things started with probably the smallest hit--a bunt single. "After that; the dam broke. Snow sparked us, it was his idea and he beat it out but it got us going." Curtis Hicks and Danny LeClair followed with base hits to load the sacks. Valley Center nearly became a Mulvane graveyard, the Hornets ahead in the opener, 5-3, before a three-run uprising in the 5th put the Cats on top, and Morgan LeClair then came in to polish things off the last three innings without giving up a hit.

Stump provided most of the fireworks for Katzenmeier's Wildcats as he clubbed a three-run homer in the fifth, then added a solo shot in the seventh. He finished with four hits in four trips, had five RBIs and scored three times. Catcher Jeff Belden also hamered a homer and Moore started the game with a four-bagger.

The nightcap against the Hornets was a defensive struggle going one extra inning before Hicks walked and scored on a single by Stump, who scored one out later on an RBI base knock by Mike Shook.

Morgan LeClair started the game and hurled a one-hitter before being relieved by Hicks in the sixth and lash inning. LeClair fanned five but constantly had runners on as the MHS defense leaked a bit with three errors.

The Wildcats will be at home today (April 24) for a GTL doubleheader against a strong Augusta team: The games start at 4 pm at the MHS baseball field.
