'Comeback' Middle Name, Cat Nine Takes Tourney

The "Comeback Kids" did their thing Tuesday, May 6, in the Chisholm Trail League Invitational Baseball Tournament and it spelled a tourney championship for MHS coach David Katzenmeier.

The Wildcats, playing in Benton, rallied with three runs in the top of the 7th inning to edge Augusta, 6-5, for the championship. Earlier in the day, the Cats were behind, 8-4, at one time but scored two times in the bottom of the last inning for a 9-8 winner over Valley Center.

"Both games were great ball games," said Katzenmeier. "In the champion-ship, it was tremendous. We had our backs to the wall but wouldn't give in."

Mike Shook's one-out triple off the fence in left-centerfield drove in Danny LeClair and Kris Withrow and LeClair scored on a two-out, full count base hit to center by Brian Cusick, the winning pitcher.

In the bottom of the inning, third sacker Shay Cornejo made a diving catch of a bunt attempt but threw wildly to first in a double play attempt. However, Shook threw out the runner at third base from his rightfield post to kill

an Oriole possibility.

In the semifinal, two were out before Curtis Hicks singled in successful pinch hitter Goeffrey Burris just before Mike Snow, who had walked, scored on an error to end the game.

The victories gave the Cats a 15-3 record overall and a 15-game winning

The Wildcats opened their run at the tournament title Monday, May 5, on home turf by waxing Winfield, 10-0, in a five-inning contest before rain moved the remaining games to Benton.

Righthander Brian Cusick pitched his



finest game of the year, yielding only two hits and fanning five. "I know it was his smartest game of the season," added Katzenmeier. "He pitched smart, was always ahead in the count and kept the batters off-balance. Too, we played solid defense behind him."

The Cats blasted away for six runs in the second and topped things off with four more in the third. Highlights of the second were a two-run single by Jeff Belden, a sac fly by Danny LeClair and a bases-filled walk to force in a run to Snow.

The Wildcats set the stage for a Chisholm Trail League-clinching series at Circle later this month by rumbling past Goddard, 11-4, and 2-0 in a twinbill Thursday, May 1, in Mulvane.

It took Katzenmeier's bats a while to sing but they did sing in a 10-run fourth inning in the opener which blew apart a tight game. Trailing, 3-1, Mulvane sent 14 batters to the plate in the inning and made things easy for the righthanded starter, Hicks, who scattered six hits and went the distance.

Stump started the inning harmlessly enough with a lead-off single and Kris Withrow also singled. Mike Shook reached on a fielder's choice before Jeff Belden drilled a two-run double down the line in left. Cusick followed with an RBI hit in front of a walk to Moore. Snow and Hicks rapped one-run singled, and Danny LeClair singled and Stump walked. Withrow delivered another run and Shook ripped a
