Friday night, Sept. 16, they knew they probably wouldn't get away with those same mistakes. ' And they didn't. Four turnovers, 11 penalties, and an early 19-0 deficit all proved to be too much to overcome as the Indians (3-0) steamed past the Wildcats, 41-21, to drop Mulvane

to 1-2 overall on the season.

Going into their home game with Andale

The Mulvane High School football team got away with mistakes in a win over Buhler.

"They're definitely the best opponent we've had so far," said MHS head coach Dave Fennewald. "They're very talented and physical, and they only start three seniors. The biggest key, though, was their team speed. They have the kind of speed that you can't simulate in practice."

The 'Cats had a very rough start offen-

sively, fumbling the ball away on two of

their first four plays from scrimmage.

Andale was ahead 13-0 before the game was four minutes old, and it eventually grew to 19-0 before the quarter was over. "We have simply had way too many turnovers and penalties over the past two games," said Fennewald. "Some of our mistakes happen due to aggression, and you don't mind those as much. It's the mental errors and

Andale scored again to go up 27-7, but the Wildcats came back with an 18-play drive that lasted 7:30, ending with a one-yard TD plunge by Knight just before halftime, and the 'Cats found themselves only behind 27-14 at the break. "We moved the ball well," said Fennewald. "We actually outgained them for the game. We had three drives of at least 10

plays. Our guys never gave up, and they

showed a lot of resilience. There was no second-guessing anybody's effort out there.'

It only took the Indians four plays in the third quarter to score another touchdown to go up 33-14, but Mulvane fought back again with another long scoring drive. A 60-yard screen pass from Ryan Herrig to Knight set up Herrig's four-yard QB keeper for a touchdown, and the 'Cats were back within 33-21.

penalty, though, Mulvane's possession ended

at the Andale 42 with no points. "That's what hurt the most," said Fennewald. "We were given a chance to get back within one score. and we couldn't capitalize." Andale would tack on one more touchdown early in the fourth quarter after intercepting a Herrig pass and returning it to the Mulvane 5. "When you play our style of offense, you're going to put the ball on the ground once in a while," said Fennewald.

All we can do is try to cut down the number of times that happens. Andale scored 21 points off of our turnovers, and none of those drives was longer than 40 yards. We have to Herrig ran for 90 yards while Sage Swaney added 44 yards on 11 carries. Knight had four
