## Boys' Comeback Comes Up Short

The Mulvane High School boys' basketball team had another close call that fell short Friday night, Jan. 27, at home against Circle.

After falling behind by 18 points early, Coach Scott Dunham's Wildcats rallied to cut the lead down to three points before running out of gas, eventually losing, 76-66. The 'Cats slipped to 2-11 overall on the season.

Mulvane's mid-game comeback was impressive, especially considering how far behind the Wildcats were early in the game. Late in the first period, the 'Cats trailed 24-6. The score was 28-12 after one quarter, but the 'Cats fought back, led by the guard combination of senior Tyler Ruder and sophomore Dylan Donaldson. By the end of the half, the Wildcats were back within seven, 40-33.

Early in the third quarter, another early Mulvane run got the 'Cats to within three points, but they wouldn't get any closer the rest of the game. Circle put on a run of their own and led by 12 after three quarters, 60-48. Mulvane never seriously threatened in the fourth quarter. In fact, Circle led by 20 before the Wildcats scored the last 10 points over the final two minutes.

Both teams shot the ball well. Circle made eight three-pointers to Mulvane's seven. The free-throw figures were just as good, if not better. Circle was 18-for-22 from the line while Mulvane only missed one free throw in the game (13-for-14).

As close as Mulvane got during the game, the 'Cats may have won if not for Circle's Logan Caldarera, who picked Friday night to have a career game. Caldarera seemed to score from everywhere on the floor, finishing with a career-high 31 points.
