Behind, 31-28, early in the fourth quarter, the Wildcats came alive as guard Jackie Smith and Cindi Lawless gunned in four points apiece while the Wildcats were running off 11 consecutive points.

"It's nice to get a victory before the home crowd," crowed Brown. "I'm really starting to feel confident about next year."

"We got rolling in the fourth quarter and Jackie got a couple key baskets and we got a couple of big rebounds from Cindi. I think more than anything that Circle got cold from the field—they only had two field goals in the fourth quarter—then they tried to put pressure on us but kept fouling. It ran some time off the clock."

The girls team also enjoyed another first. By pulling down 33 rebounds, they out-boarded the Thunderbirds, who pulled down only 28. "I think that's a first for us," said Brown. "It's the first time this year we've out-rebounded a team."

Dody, a senior closing down a fine high school career, wrapped up 11 rebounds and Shelly Gerlach and Cari Johnson each came away with seven. Jan Dankert had six.

Dody and Gerlach also paced the scoring, hitting 13 points each. Smith finished with five points and Lawless four.

The B-team assured itself of a winning season by rattling the Thunderbirds, 43-20. Vicki Phillips scored 13 points and Sheena Martinez added 12 for the Wildcats.
