Brown's girls this season against 10 losses and upped the Cats' Chisholm Trail League record to 3-9.

"I'm satisfied with the progress," said Brown after the road victory. "We wanted to double our victories this year and we did. We had none two years ago and three last year. Now six. I don't know what else I could expect."

Unless it was another victory or two before the season ends. The Wildcats will be shooting for that goal Friday night, March 2, at home against Valley Center in the regular season finale. After that, Brown's club will open Sub-State play at 7:30 Monday night, March 5, at Valley Center.

"I think the girls bounced back (from a defeat to Kingman)," said Brown. "They realized that they were better than they showed that night."

"Vicki (Kill) played her best game ever," added the Cat coach. "That's the kind of game I think she is capable of every time out."

Junior guard Sandy Whetstone recaptured her scoring tough as she led the Wildcat offense with 12 points and Kill, a senior, finished with 10 points. Next high for Mulvane was junior Cindi Lawless with nine points.

Lawless also led the Cats in rebounding, finishing with 13, three more than senior Kim Elston, as Circle enjoyed a 53-48 edge.

The Mulvane B-Team couldn't get its game going and Circle's junior varsity came away with a 31-22 victory against coach Gary Lundy's Wildcats.

Rene Lamm, a sophomore, led Mulvane in the scoring department with six points and Jan Dankert and Cindy Nelson each scored four points.

A late surge by Brown's cast fell short against Kingman as the Eagles dumped Mulvane, 35-31, Thursday night, Feb. 22, in a home game.

Junior guard Sandy Whetstone led the scorers with 13 points, seven coming in the final quarter, and Shelly Gerlach finished with 10.

Jan Dankert led Mulvane to a 45-27 edge in rebounding with 14 rebounds. Gerlach, Liz Hendricks and Kim Elston each had seven for the Wildcats.

The Mulvane B-team also stumbled, bowing, 33-30.

An 0-for-9 shooting mark in the first quarter got the Cats off to a bad start. Denise Standerfer led the scorers for Mulvane with eight points and Jan Dankert added six. Arlene Reekie and Cindy Nelson each scored five points.
